## 1. Population Needs

- 1.1 The NHS needs to plan for, and respond to, a wide range of incidents and emergencies that could affect health or patient care. These could be anything from extreme weather conditions to an outbreak of an infectious disease or a major transport accident. The Civil Contingencies Act (2004) requires NHS organisations, and providers of NHS funded care, to show that they can respond to and recover from such incidents while maintaining services.
- 1.2 This programme of work is referred to in the health community as emergency preparedness, resilience and response (EPRR). The arrangements for local health EPRR are also detailed the Health and Social Care Act 2012.

The trust is expected to cooperate with the lead commissioner to self-assess and evidence against the core standards within the timelines published by NHS England. The lead commissioner will present the agreed position of the trusts EPRR compliance at a meeting of the LHRP Executive, which should be attended by the Accountable Emergency Officer.
