1. Population Needs

1.1 National/local context and evidence base

Hazardous Area Response Teams (HART) have been established to enable ambulance services to save lives in environments where previously, our staff have been unable to safely operate. The development and implementation of HART began in 2005 and has been funded and initially managed centrally by Department of Health (DH). This was to ensure the concept was set up to a standard model across each of the ambulance trusts involved.

Since June 2011, responsibility for delivery of emergency preparedness policy in ambulance services in England has been delegated to the National Ambulance Resilience Unit (NARU), hosted by West Midlands Ambulance Trust through a Service Level Agreement with DH

3. Scope

3.1 Aims and objectives of service

It is a requirement that the latest published NARU National HART requirements is adhered to, by Trusts and Commissioning Bodies, so that the national HART capability remains resilient and prepared across the whole of England.

The purpose of the specification is to ensure that the model is delivered consistently and maintained appropriately across the country to provide assurance in the systems in place and ease for mutual aid in the event of complex or mass casualty incidents.

Review of a business case associated with an increase in HART resourcing to ensure all NARU standards can be met (as per requirements set out above) will be undertaken by commissioners in Q2 2022/23.
