# HRT pre-payment certificate – information for GP practices and community pharmacies



### **Background**

The Department for Health and Social Care (DHSC) has confirmed that the hormone replacement therapy (HRT) prepayment certificate (PPC) will be available from April 2023 and cost £18.70 a year.

New pharmaceutical regulations take effect on 1 April 2023, to accompany the introduction of the HRT PPC. They are within the <u>National Health Service</u> (<u>Amendments Relating to Pre-Payment Certificates</u>, <u>Hormone Replacement Therapy Treatments and Medicines Shortages</u>) Regulations 2023.

The HRT PPC is a new, limited scope, less expensive, prepayment certificate applicable only to HRT items listed in the drug tariff. As a consequence of its limited scope, a patient with an HRT PPC will continue to pay the prescription charge for any other (non-HRT) medicines (unless another exemption reason applies).

For people who **pay for their prescriptions**, where a HRT item and another medicine are prescribed on the same prescription, this presents a problem for people who have a HRT PPC because a prescription cannot be processed as both 'exempt' and 'paid' within the NHS prescription processing and pricing systems.

#### Ideas for pharmacies

- Explain to person because of the HRT PPC both HRT and other items cannot be issued from the same prescription and will require rewriting for the item not dispensed
- For prescriptions already in pharmacy ask the person which medicine they need more urgently
- For future HRT prescriptions, inform people of the option to sign up to electronic repeat dispensing (eRD).
- Collaborate with your local GP practices to help affected patients and identify candidates for their prescriptions to be converted to eRD.

#### **Ideas for GP practices**

- Carry out a search on SystmOne using the search found at: Dorset SystmOne GPs >
   Medicines optimisation > Womens Health to identify people prescribed HRT. NB the search
   excludes patients over the age of 60 as they are exempt from charges. If the patient already
   holds a full PPC, then no action is required.
- Contact the relevant patients by electronic means to link to HRT PPC information. Please note
  if the patient pays for several medicines, they may benefit from a full PPC covering all
  medicines rather than just the HRT PPC.
- Ensure that the HRT and any other repeat medications are **separate electronic prescription batches** to allow the dispensing pharmacy to submit separate prescriptions for the HRT (exempt) and for the other items (paid for).
- Convert all HRT prescriptions for people <60 years to eRD.</li>
- Collaborate with local community pharmacies to implement a plan for managing prescription queries around the HRT PPC in the short term and minimise any frustration for healthcare professionals and patients.
